### Request

On 1 April 2023 you asked the following in relation to our report <u>'Publication Schemes: a snapshot of compliance':</u>

FOIA s(20)(2) says that it only applies if a Public Authority adopts an appropriate ICO Model Publication Scheme "without modification". I understand this to mean that a Public Authority would have to adopt https://ico.org.uk/media/for-organisatio... verbatim without making any changes, additions or subtractions.

You haven't required this strict interpretation of "adopted the model publication scheme" for the purposes of your analysis in the "snapshot of compliance" report. (That's fine, though could potentially be confusing.) So could your clarify whether you use the weaker criterion from the report or the stricter interpretation I gave above, to judge compliance with s(20)(2)? i.e. would you regard an Authority that had not adopted your Model Publication Scheme verbatim, but nevertheless had a scheme that met the definition you quoted in your previous response to have met the requirements of FOIA s(20)(2)?

We referred you to our advice services because this was an enquiry, rather than an information request.

On 23 April 2023 you clarified that you wanted us to treat the above as an information request, and provide you with any recorded information we might hold on the matter.

Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the FOIA). As you are probably aware, this legislation provides public access to recorded information held by a public authority unless an appropriate exemption applies.

## Response

We are unable to provide a response to a hypothetical scenario under the FOIA.



To the extent that recorded information has been requested here, there is no information held.

The only recorded information we hold in relation to the methodology used in the report is contained within the report itself.

You may find our <u>model publication schemes guide</u> and our <u>FOI regulatory manual</u> helpful.

This concludes our response to your request.

# FOI review procedure
