# Response

I can confirm that we hold information in scope of your request. I will address each of your points in turn.

1)

- a) The current ICO FOI and EIR appeal caseload, broken down by public authority.
- b) If held, the exemption cited by the authority in refusing to release information.

Please provide this information as of the date of this request or the nearest possible data-collection date.

We publish quarterly reports of our <u>open FOI complaint caseload</u> on our website. This can be filtered by public authority and exemption cited.

Because this information is available to you, it is technically withheld under section 21 of the FOIA. This exempts information which is reasonably accessible to the applicant through means other than a request under the FOIA.

It is an absolute exemption, which means it is not necessary for us to consider any public interest test.

2) The current number of ICO appeal cases where a response from the Cabinet Office for submissions to ICO officers is overdue, as of the date of this request or the nearest possible data-collection date.

There are currently 13 open cases in which Cabinet Office submissions are overdue.

To provide some additional context, there are 44 open Cabinet Office cases where we are waiting for a response but have not provided a deadline. We explain this in further detail below.

3) The number of cases in the last year in which the ICO has ordered the Cabinet Office to release information in a decision notice, but the Cabinet Office failed to disclose the information within 35 days.

## **Advice and assistance**

There are 44 open Cabinet Office complaints submitted between April 2022 and March 2023 where we are waiting for submissions but we have not provided a deadline.

This is to allow the Cabinet Office capacity to balance the work required on those cases with our expectations (for all public authorities) on meeting deadlines for responses on all cases submitted to the ICO since April 2023. However, we are regularly tracking progress and engaging with the Cabinet Office on all cases in order to clear the backlog over the coming months.

There are a further three cases where a deadline was initially given, but which we are now not requiring the Cabinet Office to respond by. This is in order to aid a consistency of approach to cases outstanding between April 2022 and March 2023.
