## **IC-329103-D7V1**

### **Request**

You asked us:

*We have come across a recent decision of the First-tier Tribunal (Department of Work and Pensions v The Information Commissioner [2024] UKFTT 334 (GRC) (25 April 2024) in which the tribunal upheld an Information Commissioner decision (Reference IC-135964-Y7V0) that ordered the DWP to publish information relating to the removal of the £20 universal credit uplift introduced in response to Covid 19.*

*Are you aware whether the DWP is appealed the decision further to the Upper Tribunal and, if so, can you share the reference number or the progress made so far?*

We received your request on 29 August.

We have handled your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the FOIA).

### **Our response**

We do not hold any information within the scope of your request. We have not been informed that the DWP has applied to the Upper Tribunal to appeal this decision.

We would suggest that you make this request directly to the DWP, as they will have the most up to date information on this.

This concludes our response.
