Request

I am enquiring about a recent decision the ICO made concerning the JCIO and it's claim that it does not need to respond to FOIA enquiries. I am aware that they intend to appeal this decision; are you able to clarify which tribunal or court this appeal has gone to and if a date has been given for the appeal?

Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the FOIA).

Our response

Your information request relates to a [decision notice](#) issued on 7 May 2024, concerning the Judicial Conduct Investigations Office, dealt with under case reference IC-302476-G3S1.

We can confirm that an appeal has been made by the Judicial Conduct Investigations Office to the First-Tier Information Rights Tribunal. A date for the appeal hearing has not been set.
