

Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA)

Decision (including any steps ordered)

1. The complainant requested information relating to disability, inclusion, and equality policies. By the date of this notice the Royal Borough of Greenwich (the Council) had not issued a substantive response to this request.
2. The Commissioner's decision is that the Council has breached section 10(1) of FOIA in that it failed to provide a valid response to the request within the statutory time frame of 20 working days.
3. The Commissioner requires the Council to take the following step to ensure compliance with the legislation.
 - The Council must provide a substantive response to the request in accordance with its obligations under FOIA.
4. The Council must take this step within 35 calendar days of the date of this decision notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court pursuant to section 54 of FOIA and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.

Request and response

5. On 22 February 2023, the complainant wrote to the Council and requested information in the following terms:

"I would like to request under the Freedom of Information Act, a copy of your redeployment policy along with data on the last 10 years of staff that have been redeployed. Additionally, I would formally like to request again under the Freedom of Information Act a copy of your disability, inclusion, and equality policy, please. Finally, are you able to confirm if the council is disability confident, and if so when did this commence?" (sic)

6. The Council acknowledged the request on 23 February 2023. To date, a substantive response has not been issued.

Reasons for decision

7. Section 1(1) of FOIA states that:

"Any person making a request for information to a public authority is entitled –

(a) to be informed in writing by the public authority whether it holds information of the description specified in the request, and

(b) if that is the case, to have that information communicated to him."

8. Section 10(1) of FOIA states that a public authority must respond to a request promptly and "not later than the twentieth working day following the date of receipt".
9. On 28 April 2023 the Commissioner wrote to the Council, reminding it of its responsibilities and asking it to provide a substantive response to the complainant's request within 10 working days.
10. Despite this intervention the Council has failed to respond to the complainant.
11. From the evidence provided to the Commissioner in this case, it is clear that the Council did not deal with the request for information in accordance with FOIA. The Commissioner finds that the Council has breached section 10(1) by failing to respond to the request within 20 working days and it is now required to respond to the request in accordance with FOIA.

Right of appeal

12. Either party has the right to appeal against this decision notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from:
