

The Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA)

Decision (including any steps ordered)

1. The complainant requested information from Sussex Police about alleged offences carried out by serving police officers and staff, and the number of officers and staff under review "as part of the national vetting process review". By the date of this notice Sussex Police has not issued a substantive response to this request.
2. The Commissioner's decision is that Sussex Police has breached section 10(1) of FOIA, in that it failed to provide a valid response to the request within the statutory time frame of 20 working days.
3. The Commissioner requires Sussex Police to take the following step to ensure compliance with the legislation.
 - Sussex Police must provide a substantive response to the request in accordance with its obligations under FOIA.
4. Sussex Police must take this step within 35 calendar days of the date of this decision notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court pursuant to section 54 of FOIA and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.

Request and response

5. On 13 March 2023, the complainant wrote to Sussex Police and requested information in the following terms:

"I would like to request the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Question 1 i) Total number of Sussex Police officers accused of sexual offences, as outlined by the CPS, including domestic abuse and coercive control since April 2013? ii) Total number of allegations against police officers in (i)? iii) Type of allegation / offence? iv) What action was taken? (Arrests, Charges, No further Action, misconduct hearings etc.)

Question 2 i) Total number of staff members working for Sussex Police accused of sexual offences, as outlined by the CPS, including domestic abuse and coercive control, since April 2013. ii) Total number of allegations against staff members in (i)? iii) Type of allegation / offence? iv) What action was taken? (Arrests, Charges, No further Action, misconduct hearings etc.)

Question 3 How many officers & staff are being reviewed by Sussex Police as part of the national vetting process review that was prompted by the Home Office ... ?"

6. Sussex Police contacted the complainant on 12 April 2023 to say that it was experiencing delays but was working to provide a response as soon as possible.
7. The Commissioner's understanding is that to date, a substantive response to the request has not been issued.

Scope of the case

8. The complainant contacted the Commissioner on 19 August 2023 to complain about Sussex Police's failure to respond to their request.
9. The Commissioner has considered whether Sussex Police has complied with its obligations in relation to the time for compliance at section 10(1) of FOIA.

Reasons for decision

10. Section 1(1) of FOIA states that:

“Any person making a request for information to a public authority is entitled –

(a) to be informed in writing by the public authority whether it holds information of the description specified in the request, and

(b) if that is the case, to have that information communicated to him.”

11. Section 10(1) of FOIA states that a public authority must respond to a request promptly and “not later than the twentieth working day following the date of receipt”.

12. From the evidence provided to the Commissioner in this case, it is clear that Sussex Police did not deal with the request for information in accordance with FOIA. The Commissioner finds that Sussex Police has breached section 10(1) by failing to respond to the request within 20 working days and it is now required to respond to the request in accordance with FOIA.

Right of appeal

13. Either party has the right to appeal against this decision notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from:
